- D. Executive Director's Report
 - Brought in \$6,397,864; 97.27% of projected revenue
 - Spent \$5,997,024; 91% of projected expenses
 - ASI media \$8,000 over budget; did not generate expected revenue
 - ASI programming board over generated in revenue; \$238,000 was spent; however, still under budget
 - Beach Pride center may be over budgeted
 - Last year for the LAUP grant
 - Human resources \$25000 over, \$8000 was failed to be collected from the USU
 - Lobby core is over by \$6000, president cabinet is over by \$3500, system wide affairs is over by \$4000
 - \$64,000 remains unspent for student organizations Discussion ensued.
 - After Hours Center budgeted for \$33,694; spent \$18,462
 - Allocated one student research grant
 - May have to draw from reserve for loss of external funding due to the loss of the LAUP grant
 - \$15,834 remains for renovations to IPCDC
