 - 1) Grace Kim Effects of Game-Based Learning Tools on Children's Algebraic Thinking in their Early Math Education

Ms. Kim is conducting research to examine the effects of game based learning tools on children's algebraic thinking in their early math education. This research will fulfill the requirement of her master's degree. The funding she is requesting will be used for copy/printer paper and ink for the surveys as well as gas for travel to and from the elementary schools she will be visiting in order to conduct her research.

Mr. Haller pointed out that the student is requesting funding for supplies/items that could be used for something other than the purpose of research. There was also some question regarding the amount of students that will be surveyed and where the need arises for 2,500 surveys to be printed out. Mr. Haller also pointed out that there is a request for paper/toner as well as photocopies from Staples.

Treasurer Smith recommended that this discussion be tabled until after he speaks to the student himself in order to get a better understanding of her research and the supplies that she needs.
