Students will be traveling to Durham, NC, to attend two master classes, film screenings, and network with other professionals and colleagues in Arts programs at other universities.

Hernandez presented that their advisor has obtained a faculty grant that covered \$2,653 of the costs. They had also received additional funding from Hollywood Foreign Press and the CSULB Entertainment Alliance Faculty.

Haller pointed out that there are exceptions to the AB 1887 travel restriction bill and that it would be up to the board to decide whether the application meets any of the following requirements:

- Enforcement of California law, including auditing and revenue collection
- Litigation
- To meet contractual obligations incurred before January 1, 2017
- To comply with requests by the Federal government to appear before committees
- To participate in meetings or training required by a grant or required to maintain grant funding
- To complete job required training necessary to maintain licensure or similar standards required for holding a position in the event that comparable training cannot be obtained in California or a different state not affected
- For the protection of public health, welfare, or safety as determined by the CSU or other state agencies

Taylor noted that requests for funding before the AB 1887 travel restrictions were enforced.

Vournas voiced that she does not believe this application fits any of the requirements listed above.

Haller read an email from the Dean's ASM that stated the travel plans were made prior to the enactment of this law because it was planned and approved before January 1, 2017 and it is to attend a meeting/event that was required by a grant or required to maintain grant funding.

VP Vournas pointed out that ASI funding would be going to the applicants after January 1, 2017.

Taylor explained that as long as the trip itself was approved before the January 1, 2017 deadline, that the sources of funding could be obtained after the fact.

Haller asked what the rate would be if they wanted to purchase tickets individually. Aviles explained that the tickets were only sold as packages and individual tickets could not be purchased.

Treasurer Smith asked what the students plan on doing if they did not receive any funding from ASI. Aviles explained that any funding they did not receive would have to be out of pocket per student.

Treasurer Smith recommended allocating \$900 to be divided among the applicants.

Treasurer Smith stated that funds allocated must be used for events that are held on campus so that CSULB students will benefit from this event.

Rezvan explained that they were not able to reserve the ballrooms for the needed dates because either the campus was closed or those dates were not available.

Sen. Kim asked how many CSULB students they estimate will attend this event. Rezvan estimated that about 250 students and 50 faculty members would attend this event. The remaining 100 will be their families or their friends.

Treasurer Smith said that he felt that the event should be held on campus to make events funded with student funds be accessible to those students.

VP Vournas said that she does not feel that it is equitable to punish the organization for having the event off campus to accommodate the date of this cultural holiday.

Rezvan stated that the organization would much rather hold the event on campus because it is much more convenient and accessible to students.

VP Vournas recommended that this application be tabled pending further discussion and finalization of the location of this event.

Treasurer Smith reported the following:

- He has noticed some organization do not take advantage of Spring Allocations or they do not use the funds once they are approved
- His proposal is that the funds used for Spring Allocations only be used for college councils and sports. This means that organizations be required to come before the board around the time of their event
- He feels that this will also prevent a previous year's Treasurer and BOC from deciding how funds are used for the next academic year
  - VP Vournas voiced concern of a disconnect between the advisors and presidents of these organizations. They are not being advised correctly as to the application process.
- Treasurer Smith feels that whatever programs are being put on during the present year, those need to go before the current board.
  - Waterfield believes that it is important to look at which groups the rollbacks are actually coming from; they might very well be coming from college councils and sports. He does not believe it is

not fair to make a blanket statement that sort of punishes the organizations that are efficient for those that are not efficient.

- Taylor agrees and believes that there should be reports that give the board a breakdown of what organizations asked for and what they actually spent.
- VP Vournas suggested that, before moving forward, Treasurer Smith reach out to organizations to find out what student needs actually are.
