C. Student Research Fund (SRF)

1) Action Item: Ajay Shirolkar – Role of Carbon Nanotube Alignment in a Cardiovascular Patch Shirolkar is conducting research to discover the effectiveness of a cardiovascular patch in patients with heart disease. They are requesting funds that will be used to cover the costs associated with highly specialized equipment rental, car rental and fuel, and auxiliary materials.

Nino asked how they came up with the quote for \$250 for travel to UC Irvine, since this seems a bit excessive. Shirolkar explained that this is just an estimate of the amount that would be needed to cover the costs of the trips to UCI.

Bose asked if the car rental and gas estimated was just for one trip, or multiple trips. Shirolkar answered that this estimate was for multiple trips to UCI since they would not be able to collect all of the data required to complete their research.

Yamagiwa asked what the \$230 for auxiliary materials was for. Shirolkar stated that this would cover any costs associated with having their equipment rental for more than the estimated 10 hours.
