  - Sexual Health and Wellness and Access to Contraception
    - CDC: 20 million new STI cases 50% are from ages 15-24
    - Study from School of Health and Human Performance at Georgia College
      - 85% of college campuses give out free condoms
      - However, 96% only distribute them in their Student Health Centers
    - Free condoms in the Student Health Services Center and LGBTQ+ Resource Center
      - Not the best solution because of privacy
    - > Select bathrooms sometimes have free condoms but not very many do
    - Proven to be the best way because of privacy and ease
    - > More bathrooms need to provide and have condom dispensers
  - Actions Taken:
  - AIDS Healthcare Foundation
    - Provide free condoms and HIV testing
    - > 2015: Whittier College Initiative
      - Provided 15 condom dispensers and condoms to the campus
      - $\circ$   $\;$  Made sure that they were always filled or had extras available
  - The Condom Collective
    - Give out 500 free Trojan brand condoms to students to hand out on campus
    - > Also have initiatives about giving free condom dispensers to college campuses around the country
    - Emailed Kinjo Kiema, Manager of State and Local Campaigns
