- What is the California Assembly Bill 540?
- Signed into law by Governor Gray Davis on Oct 12, 2001
- Allows undocumented, asylee, immigrants and other eligible students to receive in-state tuition at California's public colleges and universities as long as the student attended high school in CA for 3 yrs. or more and received a CA HS Diploma or GED prior to start of semester
- Different from DACA because as long as you met requirements above, you can receive in-state tuition without having to be a DACA recipient
