- A. Discussion Item: 2021-22 Cabinet SMART Goals
 - 1. To become more knowledgeable of our constituents we will develop relationships, build trust, listen,

and follow up throughout the semesters, with student organizations and other departments so we become experts in our communities. We will make initial connections with most constituents by October. To maintain a healthy relationship, we shall have internal check-ins in December (fall semester) and in February (spring semester).

- 2. To increase communication between ASI and the student body throughout the 2021-2022 Academic Year, the Cabinet will attend campus events (in person and virtually) to increase visibility and invite the student body to connect with us during office hours and via email. Progress can be measured at the end of each semester by tracking event attendance in weekly Commissioner reports and office hours and/or email communication from students.
- 3. We will facilitate a seamless transition for students back to on campus events and in person classes by developing relationships with our communities as well as CAPS, BPE, and other campus organizations that can account for student safety, wellbeing, and involvement. We will measure students' satisfaction by providing an incentivized survey in November and April to assess the Cabinet's progress in strengthening the transition back to campus.
- 4. We will increase student participation by getting more students connected to and involved in ASI/campus events to support academic and personal success. We will conduct at least 2 collaborative events with Beach team, such as conducting presentations to Beach Teamers about our roles and positions. We will also create an open Q&A event session for students interested in Cabinet in the spring semester. This will support the overall reintegration of students back to campus.

Ray: suggested creating a committee for check-ins.

Islas: suggested increasing Cabinet awareness online, especially for posting office hours.

Silva: contact student organizations for their needs, events, and ASI awareness; utilize social media more.

Martinez: suggested adding an ASI Government app to the Long Beach app

Zamora: ASI boards will be participating in the ASI Elections kick-off event which will be a great opportunity for outreach and gathering student input.
