A. Discussion Item: National Voter Registration Day Padilla: Dropped off the ten completed ballots to city clerk's office

Galindo: Keeping with the improvement efforts; Involvement and learned a lot from this National Voter Registration event; Can now best think of strategies for next time around; Donut initiatives went well

San Miguel: Location is a key as they strategize; Have a checklist of what worked for next time

Deng: Could find a more strategic location next time; Maybe if they could have started earlier, they could capture more students

San Miguel: Having an interactional approach could play an advantageous role

Galindo & Pham: Need more support and be more creative next time

Deng: Maybe have a script next time and include cognizance of ASI's purpose, most especially Lobby Corps on the script

The board discussed on a date for the second voter registration drive. Board agreed on Nov 13th 10am-2pm, to coincide with the Farmer's Market.

- B. Information Item: Basic Assistance for Students in College Act
 Padilla: CSSA Legislative Affairs Committee ended up pushing back the event date to October 19th
- C. Discussion Item: 2019-20 Policy Agenda Padilla: Asked the board to email them their advocacy points, so the essential focuses could be added to agenda for next meeting

Galindo: Talked about lowering of tuition at CSULB through legislation efforts Deng: Was just accepted to a research project which could help out with advocacy.

San Miguel: Suggested to set priorities and take if further from there

Prado: Supported the board what they thought about the existing policy agenda and what can be done to improve

McManius: Enumerate and specify these priorities from CSULB and through CSU system-wide; They can send the policy copy they have for supplementary research upon request

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion Item: AB 32 Detention Facilities: Private, For-Profit Administration Services V

This bill, on or after January 1, 2020, would prohibit the department from entering into or renewing a contract with a private, for-profit prison to incarcerate state prison inmates, but would not prohibit the department from renewing or extending a contract to house state prison inmates in order to comply with any court-ordered population cap. The bill would also prohibit, after January 1, 2028, a state prison inmate or other person under the jurisdiction of the department from being incarcerated in a private, for-profit prison facility. This bill would also prohibit, with exceptions, the operation of a private detention facility, as defined, within the state.

Galindo: Advised to show support because this is particularly for basic human civil rights effort.

Padilla: suggested creating a letter for the governor's review.

B. Discussion Item: SB 354 California DREAM Loan Program: Graduate Degree Programs V

This bill would, commencing with the 2020-21 academic year, expand DRAM loan eligibility to a student who is enrolled in a program of study leading to a professional or graduate degree, including, but not limited to, a teaching credential, if the student meets the other applicable qualifications. This bill would require the participating institution to determine the proportion of program funding used for instructional programs and for graduate programs. The bill would require that priority under this program be given to loans for instructional programs.

Padilla: this program is receiving CSSA supporting; Advised the board to check out what CSSA is not supporting; focus on the September meeting then grasp from there
