A. Information Item: AB 930 CSU Executive Compensation

Galindo: First part requires for CSULB to put yearly report and submit it to the Sacramento; 2<sup>nd</sup> board of trustees vote to raise tuition; as of right now, no update yet on this bill; Inside the policy agenda, there is a section for college affordability; We as a board need to look at AB 940? Will come back for more info next meeting RE check and balances.

Prado: there is a discrepancy with number on the compensation.

Deng: President Conoley's salary schedule is not in the median compare to the median for a university president – great discussion on college affordability.

## B. Information Item: SB 72 Provisional Ballots

- provisional ballots are used when there are questions about a voter's eligibility
- in California, there's a law that provisional ballots can go out up to 14 days before election day, or turned in on election day
- this law will require all polling centers to allow provisional ballots

Pham: SB72 has been approved by the governor.
