VP Vournas states that CSULB has the privilege of being so close to the Chancellor's Office in Long Beach, and therefore could have a greater impact on the tuition increase than other CSUs.

VP Vournas and President Flores both plan to create: a campus wide forum to educate students on the tuition increase and a phone bank.

VP Vournas says that there is a possibility that BOT could pass the tuition increase but we will not know until the bill is approved, how much will go to the CSU systems.

Sen. Gomez says that we should, as a board, decide what we want to do

VP Vournas said "Change demands sacrifice, sacrifice demands advocacy, and advocacy isn't passive. Advocacy is action and advocacy is taking the steps to make sure we support our students and this board will not remain passive in this situation." VP Vournas wants all members of Senate to reach out to as many students and organizations that we can to talk about this issue.
