 - Trump's budget proposal, if enacted, would:
 - Enact a \$9.2 billion, or 13 percent, cut to the U.S. Dept. of Education's budget.
 - ➤ Slash Pell grants by \$3.9 billion

- Eliminate entirely the \$733 million Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant program
- ➤ Cut TRIO and GEAR Up programs by \$200 million
- ➤ Delete \$2.4 billion in Title II, Part A funding that helps schools and districts improve teacher and principal quality along with providing professional development
- ➤ Cut \$1.2billion in funding for the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program- after school program funding
- ➤ Provide unprecedented federal investments in school choice.
- Expand charter schools and publicly funded private school options
- > Provide a \$168 million increase for Charter School Program grants (boosting the program by half)
- ➤ Propose a new \$250 million private school choice program, allowing working class families to use public funds for private schools
- Increase a \$15 billion allocation of Title I funds for poor students by \$1 billion, encouraging local school districts to adopt school choice
- Student Success Center being built in fall 2018
