Sen. Carancho began the discussion about how many students are upset over the changes of the commencement ceremony.

- Shortened commencement ceremonies

President Nino presented the following:

- Shortening the time of the ceremonies would be more efficient
- Intramural field accommodates more individuals

Sen. Almahdi asks what is being done with the \$45 fee, and the money that will be saved.

President Nino spoke about reducing the cost of commencement in the future to \$37, and there will be a post ceremony evaluation in regards to the breakeven model. He suggested that the senate ask for a more consulted process in the future to voice their opinions over the changes.

Sen. Carancho asked the board if they will be taking a stance about the new commencement ceremonies. There has been a petition signed by 5,878 individuals against the new ceremonies.

Sen. Mejia noted the effects that the students will feel because of these changes. They have been waiting years for the ceremony, dreaming of the quad but now they are changing the location.

President Nino pointed out that the production of the ceremonies would be the same, the only changes are the location.

Many Senators voiced their concerns over the transparency between students, and weighing the pros and cons of the changes to commencement. They should be considering the individuals who would be attending the ceremony and how best to accommodate them.
