2) Action Item: SR #2019-06: In Support of Increased Transparency (1st Reading)
Kim: resolution (reso) is in response to the Oct 23rd Campus Clash event; they received emails from students upset about the of lack of transparency and having received a notification email only five hours before the event, especially since there were police, K-9 units, and barriers; reso calls for university transparency by giving students two weeks' notice of event time and location; students felt unsafe and unwelcome; having ASI facilities, funded by student fees, designated as safe spaces on campus will help

Mejia: reso calls for more awareness on campus; students, and organizations (orgs) specifically, are under the impression that ASI gave their stamp of approval and didn't notify students and orgs; ASI usually stays neutral on these sorts of events; there should be regulations on deadlines for event notification

Discussion ensued regarding:

• Intent of reso (Campus Clash specific, transparency)

- Safe spaces
- K-9 unit deployment
- precautionary steps that could be taken (USU signage; university email notification)
- dialogue vs. legislation
- training (counter-protesting, conflict resolution)
- existing campus emergency notification
- President Conoley's message timing

Haller:

- Line 22: sentence doesn't make sense; what are you trying to convey?
- Line 31: citation doesn't prove training is necessary, but may be desirable or advisable
- Line 37: "disappointed" doesn't accurately express what students felt; what is meant by "impassive physical actions"?
- Line 45: create and promote nonviolent resistance; as there's a cost associate with that, the cost should be disclosed; ASI does not have the authority to compel the university to provide training
- Line 49: all listed facilities are public, are on a public university campus, and people cannot be excluded based on the safe space definition listed on line 40
- Providing advance notice: not possible in every case;
- misguided to think ASI can predict which events might potentially bring protesters; prior Campus Clash event was incident-free
- university provided security measures once it was found out that outside protesters might attend
- recommended the first step be dialoguing with the USU's Facility Committee
