Aguilar: A specialist stated their concerns regarding SB 24 during public comments. Aguilar added that Pregnant and Parenting Club is recent on campus, and there is not enough support for this group either.

Maya: Highlighted Aguilar's opinion on SB 24 and argued that the 200K is to start the program, they will work with insurance companies and an ultrasound machine will be included. Maya presented a sheet with 66 signatures with CSULB students supporting the bills to the Senators.

Major: The specialist informed 8% of chances of complication, if the students have a complication how can they ensure their safety?

Fukuda: Even at clinics such as Planned Parenthood, patients are given the pill to go home and in case of emergency, they have to seek appropriate care.

Contreras: Suggested to partner up with local hospitals to give assistance to students.

Canales: Read the e-mail from the Health Services Office regarding SB 24.

Ullah: This service would be provided to all CSUs; other campuses may need the service as well.

Fukuda: Having SB 24 passed, will encourage development in the Student Health Center.

Maya: SB 24 is about students' access to adequate healthcare and rights.

Howansky: Urged Senators to consider how all parties will be affected if SB 24 is passed.

Jordan: Recommended the CHESS delegation to lobby for reproductive rights but not support SB 24.

Martinez: There are more questions instead of answers regarding SB 24.

Aguilar: Recommended to not put our names on a bill that is not fully clear.

Jordan: Raised his concern regarding SB 532 – How will this bill assist the Parking Services when considering their deficits? And suggested communication efforts with Parking, Faculty and Students to balance fairness and services.

McDonald: Explained College Athlete Bills of Rights, regarding student athletes not losing their athletic scholarships if injured.

12. VOLUNTARY CLOSING COMMENTS

Michael Constable: Argued that there is also a survey of 68 students that are Pro-life on campus. Raised the concern that every question regarding SB 24 were not fully answered prior to deciding to approve the bill. Constable stated that is unfortunate that even against the specialist advice in the room the board still approved SB 24.

Stacie Higgins: SB 24 does not state that ultrasound services will be provided with the funding. The language is vague. The senators did not seem clear about the specifics of the bill prior to supporting it.

Jessy Rosales: By 2023, there will be training and a process of implementation to secure that Health Centers will be equipped for the program. The point of the bill is that students are taken care on their campuses.

Rachel Hearing: Stated that abortion is a heavy physical and mental experience to the mother facing it.

Camille: Encouraged senators to ask the student body and the Student Health Center of why many students are opposed to SB 24.
