

#### How are we funded?

Education Code 89701-89704 outlines the financial structure of Parking and Transportation Services.

#### Self-Supported:

- Financed primarily through the collection of user fees (permits).

#### · Exclusive Use of Funding:

- Parking revenue can only be used to fund parking programs/expenses.
- Citation revenue can only be used exclusively to fund Parking Enforcement and Sustainable Transportation.





#### 11. VOLUNTARY CLOSING COMMENTS

B LONG BEACH

Nevin: clarified that the difference between the two child care center resolutions that Senate passed last week was that one was for the school age program and the other was for the infant toddler program.

Lendrum: encouraged board to a fuller understanding of the power of legislation and its potential impact; shared example of how the ASI Senate Resolution #2015-12 (urging the California State Legislature to increase the number of student trustees on the California State University (CSU) Board of Trustees) led to both CSU student trustees having voting privileges beginning 2020, whereas before only one was voting.

Deng: Lobby Corps will be attending CSUnity this coming weekend; many of the panels will be related to Basic Needs and issues relevant to Senate; please forward any questions or requests for information to Deng.

Bose: Last year, Athletics created a Diversity and Inclusion Committee that works on social justice, diversity, and inclusion initiatives specifically within Athletics; committee is recruiting up to three of non-athletics committee members; send Bose an email if interested.
