## 3. INVOCATION – 2016-17 ASI Vice President Logan Vournas

Vournas posed to the board the same question they were asked at the beginning of their ASI leadership journey - Why are you here? Vournas stressed to the board that each student vote means they believe and trust in you, and that now you have the opportunity and responsibility to create change that will affect students. Vournas encouraged that while we might not be able to make systemic change overnight, we can make changes that affect the everyday life of students. Vournas highlighted student-led initiatives such as the All-gender restrooms, the Beach Pantry, scooters for disabled students, the 24-hour Study Center, a 24-hour Library during Finals, and much more. Students need to know what ASI does and that we have a systematically instrumental voice on campus that isn't dependent on any other part of the campus. Students deserve to know that their elected representatives stand for and who will fight for them in meeting their needs. Vournas asked the board to further reflect on the ASI mission slogan of For Students By Students: what does it mean and why.
