Deng: can we add language requesting professors include some safety tips at the beginning of the semester. Almahdi: mandating trainings is out of our jurisdiction; however, we can include language that tells the university that it is something the students want.

Ortiz: at Campus Planning Focus Group, the director of facilities mentioned that classrooms with a 60-seat minimum would be completed first; requested that the finalized resolution be sent to the person in charge of the locks as well.

Lendrum: Question for Jarvis, are faculty mandated to take training for these kind of situations? Jarvis: We receive emails notification of training opportunities but they are not mandatory.

Phong: per an update from University Police Chief Solorzano, 38 of 235 spaces have had completed; Physical Planning and Facility Maintenance (PPFM) plans on completing an additional 38 rooms by the end of fall semester.
