# (M) Lam (S) Douvan to approve SR #2020-31 Support for Sanitation Improvements (1st Reading) VOTE ON THE MOTION PASSES 17-0-2

Lam: voiced concern regarding the two requirements are SAT/ACT scores and GPA; if we remove SAT/ACT then we are only left with GPA which is a number metric; suggested adding a required statement.

Deng: we lack resources to get all the students eligible into the CSU system; even if we get rid of the SAT/ACT; problem will be now it is based on grades as various schools have different resources and grading; school is lacking resources to allow every eligible student into the freshman class.

Hafen: noted that schools throughout the county are different so the SAT/ACT standardized it which is also flawed.

  - Working on planning for summer
  - University is restricting campus events until at least August 24<sup>th</sup>; will have a big impact on ASI in terms of staff training
  - Working with Bose on hosting a student forum with key campus departments to answer key questions; May 4<sup>th</sup>, 11 am
  - Processing ASI/USU budget; will be presented to Senate next week
- C. Information Item: Administrator Vice President Michele M. Cesca: Graduation Spring 2020
  - Been busy planning for Commencement 2020
  - President's priority is for an in-person Commencement; tentatively looking at the weekend before thanksgiving and continue that week
  - exploring virtual celebration opportunities

Chris: Looking at the virtual celebrations that are going on and talking to different people to get input; opportunity for everyone to speak using the speech component; will do a virtual calling of names; everyone would have an opportunity for it to be personalized; can put that live; share it with families

so there is a celebration experience; targeting June or early summer; wondering if a virtual celebration is something the students would appreciate.

Almahdi: an opportunity for it to be personalized; could you elaborate.

Chris: vendor provides a standard template for name, etc. we can opt to have students personalize their slides so they can put their personal photos and quotes if the students are interested; we can enhance their experience that way.

Hafen: would this be an alternative to the thanksgiving celebration or a separate event?

Cesca: No, this is for now; will continue to plan that for fall celebration along with this.

Hafen: lot of graduating students might not be available locally right now so that is a great idea.

Douvan: students pay a fee for graduation so if it is online then would that fee be reimbursed?

Cesca: We are still planning for the fall celebration apart from the virtual celebration; all which costs so we are not discussing reimbursement yet.

Triska: is it fixed for the university to plan around thanksgiving or is it flexible? Just so international students can book their tickets in prior.

Cesca: We are planning for then, but everything is unpredictable so don't recommend booking any tickets until the official announcement is out from the Chancellor.

Douvan: essential student concern; initial plan for graduation was that students would walk directly and paid for that so would this be something students can opt out of

Cesca: we have not discussed that yet but will talk about it.

Maythe Alderete Gonzalez, Chief Diversity Officer: like the concept; consider emailing the students who will graduate and get their survey?

Cesca: like that idea; will have to see how much time we have.

#### 11. CLOSING COMMENTS

Bose:

- Major surveys have been sent out to students; Campus Climate survey is very important; advertisements on social media to begin April 29<sup>th</sup>
- Wednesday is Denim Day

Triska: received an email of parking refund resources and voiced concern that there are no resources for international students.

Almahdi: parking is still working on the refunds; it will take a couple of weeks because of the huge amount of refunds that need to be processed.

Almahdi: will send out the senate recommendation resolution to everyone to add to it; drafts are due by Thursday.
