Nevin: primary goal is to maintain current student employment; recommending the dissolution of

the Recycling Center budget due to issues of mainly serving non-students, the program has been operating at a loss over the past several years, and costly deferred maintenance; focus has been shifted to other sustainability areas; the 13 students employees still have employment with ASI but in other places.

Ortiz: regarding the lawsuit for CSU and UC systems; would that affect any of the ASI funding?

Nevin: that lawsuit is one of 20 across country; class action suiters have asked for return of some of the mandatory fee revenue which we benefit from; if they are successful in court it would impact us greatly; in constant conversations; trying to return fees where appropriate; will keep you all updated.

Deng: at today's Lobby Corps Zoom meeting, Velasquez and Chief Government Relations Officer Pham shared information regarding SP 493 and how it would update how our university handles campus sexual assault cases; worked with another organization to advocate and lobby for the support of this bill; it is a two year term; during this crisis it is especially important to have clear legislation because school isn't in session but these people's lives haven't stopped.

11. CLOSING COMMENTS

Chiu: voiced constituent request that refund for suspended campus services, such as for the USU; also, what are the student excellence fees intended for?

Almahdi: fees are used for ASI to continue having those facilities as opposed to operating them; ASI would fall behind on the mortgage without that fee.

Galindo: fees for maintaining the building as the whole money wasn't paid after the construction.

Bose: Student Excellence Fee http://daf.csulb.edu/budgetcentral/pdf/Student-Excellence-Funding-Report-2018-19.pdf

Nevin: each area of each ASI program has been reviewed; ASI has reimbursed each IPCDC family from March despite being operational on some of those days; ASI estimated to experience a million and a half in losses by the end of the year; ASI fees is the bond we have that is 5 million dollars per year; if we were to return the mandatory fee revenue, it would possibly cripple the organization in an unimaginable way.

Torres: regarding the virtual celebration survey, students are confused as to if it would replace the actual commencement; voiced support for unlimited Zoom for group projects, for convenience especially if the

fall instruction will be online.

Almahdi: reiterated last week's announcement that there would be an in-person celebration as well; agreed that a Zoom upgrade would make group work easier.

Bose:

- Student Excellence Fee: two layers health and wellness component and technology component; online link has examples of different programs across campus that use this fee; these are resources that are still being used
- Zoom Pro: SLD is working with academic technology; Zoom Pro access has been granted to clubs and organizations
- Received access to Microsoft Teams, which will allow people to have longer meetings with more features starting summer
- Student Health Services, CAPS, etc. are services still available for students via alternate format
