3. INVOCATION: Dr. Mary Ann Takemoto, CSULB Associate Vice President, Division of Student Affairs Dr. Takemoto commended the board's dedicated efforts and leadership during this past year especially with tragic deaths of George Floyd and many others, the protests for social justice, Covid, a terribly divisive presidential election, and the current rise in anti-Asian sentiment.

Takemoto shared their insights on a study entitled "Who speaks and who listens" where they scholars examined classroom behavior of male and female college students. Observations showed gendered classroom participation patterns. On average, men students spoke 1.6 times as often as women, and also speak out without raising hands, interrupt, and engage in prolonged conversations during class more than women students. Also, men's language is assertive, whereas women's is hesitant and apologetic.

Takemoto shared personal parallels to the study in their own academic and professional journeys, and charged leaders to be more aware and especially understand dynamics in group settings. Takemoto encouraged the board to allow all voices (especially the marginalized) to be heard, not mistake the one who speaks the most as the one who has the most important thing to say or to contribute, and engage those who are silent. Having a seat at the table is crucial in order to bring about institutional change.

In closing, Dr. Mary Ann Takemoto shared that they'll be retiring at the end of the semester after 32 years in higher education and 16 years at CSULB.
