Barcelona reviewed the following proposed revisions:

- 3.3 Graduation Celebrations: The Director of Student Life and Development has been delegated authority by the Business and Finance Committee to review and evaluate the funding requests submitted by the respective clubs and to determine the amount of funds to allocate to each of them. This determination will be forwarded to the ASI Government Office by the date and time annually specified by the ASI Vice President of Finance. Allocation summaries must be forwarded to the Business and Finance Committee where they are subject to final approval. The total amount of funds allocated to Graduation Celebrations is determined by the ASI Senate in its annual spring budget approval process.
- 3.4 Current Year Unallocated Fund: Applications for funding from the CYUF will be capped at \$3,000.
- 5.2 Permissible Purchases: Whenever possible and in order to promote sustainability and the support of CSULB students, organizations should use on-campus printing options.
- 5.3 Prohibited Purchases, Community Relations Activities: An exception to this prohibition is the hosting of an activity with the sole purpose of raising funds by a student organization for the benefit of a charitable cause.
- 6.3 Accessibility: ASI mandates that no program or activity funded by student organization grants may exclude from participation, deny benefits to, or subject to discrimination any individual based on disability. Therefore, ASI requires that organizations receiving grants act to provide reasonable accommodations in all facilities and services immediately upon notification that accommodations are required. Further, organizations must provide clear communication regarding the process by which such accommodations may be requested.

For ASI-funded events with anticipated attendance of 200 or more individuals, student organizers should arrange to have qualified interpreters and/or real-time captioners available to provide access for Deaf or Hard of Hearing attendees. The grant award may cover some costs for this service. This requirement shall apply to programs such as concerts, lectures, seminars, workshops, and guest speakers.

Aceves reviewed the following CSSA supported bills:

- AB 1456 (Medina):
 - AB 1456 establishes two streams of financial aid to focus on the specific needs of students at two-year colleges and four-year universities. The programs would be renamed as Cal Grant 2 and Cal

Grant 4.

- For students at the community college, AB 1456 (under Cal Grant 2) would increase the numbers eligible for aid from 124,000 to a little over 360,000. Students would receive the current \$1,656 level of access award with an adjustment tied to inflation.
- It would shift California's financial aid system to student need model that removes eligibility requirements for age, GPA, and time out of high school.
- CA-AB1185 (McCarty)
 - This bill for applications made in the 2021–22 and 2022–23 academic years only, authorize applicants for these awards to submit complete financial aid applications for the first award year in the academic year immediately following their high school graduation or equivalent for the immediately following award year, and to submit complete financial aid applications for the 2nd award year in the 2nd academic year after high school graduation or its equivalent. SB22 – enable bonds to go out in 2022; when 15.5 bond for K-16 to be split evenly between CSUs.
 - For applications submitted in the 2021–22 and 2022–23 academic years only, this bill would provide that prohibition would instead apply to students who will not be 29 years of age or older by December 31 of the award year.
 - This bill would authorize a student otherwise eligible to receive a California Community College Transfer Cal Grant Entitlement Award who attended a California community college in the 2019–20 academic year to use the award for the 2021–22 and 2022–23 academic years.
