 - Women's soccer, Women's volleyball, and Cross country: successful season
- Winter season sports

 - ✓ Women's basketball tied for 1st place with UC Irvine
 - ✓ Men's basketball tied for 2nd with CSU Fullerton, with 1 game behind Hawaii
- Spring season sports
 - > CSULB leads in adherence to Covid safety measures, including athlete testing
