Title: Resolution in Support of Licensure for Registered Dieticians in the State of California

WHEREAS the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) is the single

recognized voice for over 37,000 students of the university; and

WHEREAS the ASI Senate serves as the Board of Directors for the corporation, and implements its authority

as the legislative branch, voicing students' needs and interests to fulfill the mission of students

self-governance; and

WHEREAS the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences at CSULB currently offers a Bachelor's of

Science degree in Dietetics and Food Administration with an option in Nutrition and Dietetics,

and many of the students in the program aspire to be dietitians in California; and

WHEREAS the program is expanding and had an enrollment of 243 students in Spring 2016, 11 faculty with

Registered Dietician (R.D.)credentials, 1 with a doctorate, 7 tenured R.D.'s and 5 staff members;

and

WHEREAS on February 16, 2011 Assembly Member Hayashi introduced bill AB575 which died in the

Assembly Desk Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee; and

WHEREAS Bill AB575 intended that "Only a person licensed as a dietitian or otherwise authorized to

practice under this chapter shall practice "dietetics" or "medical nutrition therapy<sup>1</sup>;" and

WHEREAS dietetics has been defined as "the integration and application of principles derived from the

sciences of food, nutrition, management, and communication, and from the biological, physiological, behavioral, and social sciences to achieve and maintain optimal human health<sup>2</sup>;"

and

WHEREAS Medical Nutrition Therapy has been defined as "the use of specific nutrition services for the

purpose of disease management to treat or rehabilitate an illness, injury, or condition<sup>3</sup>;" and

WHEREAS out of 50 states about 14 do not have licensure requirement<sup>4</sup>; and

WHEREAS currently there is no "licensure/registration requirement for providing nutrition care" in the

State of California and the current registration law included in the business and professions code

2585-2586.8 provides qualifications to be recognized as a "registered dietitian" only<sup>5</sup>; and

WHEREAS requirements for State Licensure/Certification include baccalaureate or post-baccalaureate from

a regionally accredited institution with a program in dietetics, community nutrition, nutritional

science; completion of the R.D. exam, and 900 or more hours supervised experience to meet

qualifications under public or private agency<sup>6</sup> approved by the Commission on Dietetic Accreditation of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics; and WHEREAS the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics supports licensure to protect public health especially in the case of medical nutrition therapy where inaccurate data provided by unlicensed "nutritionists" has been linked to fatality due to the lack of understanding of the medical condition and improper nutritional advice<sup>7</sup>; and WHEREAS licensure "standardizes practices, services, and activities that require a high level of specialized knowledge and skill;" and most health professionals such as physicians, nurses, and pharmacists must be licensed, and the WHEREAS same is true for many other occupations such as social workers, lawyers, and accountants8;" and States regulate professions such as nurses, doctors, and physical therapists to protect the public WHEREAS from harm by unqualified practitioners; now therefore, be it RESOLVED that the Associated Students' Board of Directors strongly supports the Dietetics program at CSULB and the Student Dietetics Association for their desire to bring awareness to an issue currently affecting registered dietitians in the State of California; and be it RESOLVED that this resolution be presented to California State Student Association (CSSA) for potential endorsement of this issue since it not only affects CSULB students but it affects registered dietitians state wide; and be it RESOLVED that this resolution should be presented among Lobby Corps so they may address such issue to state members of the office; and be it finally RESOLVED that upon its approval by the ASI President, electronic copies of this resolution be distributed to CSULB President Jane Conoley, Vice President for Student Affairs Carmen Taylor, Dean of Students Jeff Klaus, incoming Dean of the College of Health and Human Services Monica Lounsbery, Family and Consumer Sciences Department Chair Dr. Wendy Reiboldt, the Daily 49er, the Union Weekly, the Press-Telegram, the Long Beach Post, and the Long Beach Register.
