WHEREAS the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) Board of Directors serves as the recognized voice of over

37,000 students at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB); and

WHEREAS a vast majority of the majors that fall under the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics

(CNSM) are impacted; and

as of fall 2014, there were over 2,600 full-time, declared students under the CNSM;² and WHEREAS

WHEREAS all majors under the CNSM have the option of undergraduate research, and the requirement of

graduate research;3 and

WHEREAS students in the CNSM are highly encouraged to pursue research and have the option of joining

the BUILD, MARC, KEMP, or RISE programs, which require about 15 hours of research during the

academic year, often conducted after hours due to class scheduling conflicts; and

as fall 2014, over 1,400 of the students enrolled as full-time CNSM majors self-identified as WHEREAS

"female;" and

WHEREAS after 9PM, the only available food and drink locations are the Beach Hut near the University

> Library and the vending machines near the Liberal Arts buildings, both of which are a considerable distance from the Molecular and Life Sciences Center (MLSC); and

WHEREAS that women ages 18-24 who are in college are three times more likely to experience sexual

violence;6 and

WHEREAS that many female-identified students have expressed feeling uncomfortable walking around

campus after hours, but also desire food and drink to carry them through the long hours of

research; now therefore, be it
