WHEREAS the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) Board of Directors at California State University, Long Beach

(CSULB) is the single recognized voice for over 37,000 students; and

WHEREAS the CSULB ASI mission states, "the Associated Students of CSULB seeks to facilitate the

> achievement of students' educational objectives and life goals through programs, services, and facilities that advocate student needs and interests, compel student representation in campus decision making and provide students with resources that they identify as necessary for their

intellectual, social and physical development;"1 and

WHEREAS Title IX protection from sexual harassment, stalking, sexual violence and misconduct,

> established in 2011, set a precedent to "prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs or activities operated by recipients of Federal financial assistance. Sexual harassment of students, which includes acts of sexual violence, is a form of sex discrimination prohibited by

Title IX;"2 and

WHEREAS Title IX defines sexual violence as rape, sexual assault, sexual battery, and sexual coercion;³ and

WHEREAS 1 in 5 women are victims of completed or attempted sexual assault while in college and 6.1

percent of males are victims of completed or attempted sexual assault during college; and

WHEREAS 25 incidents of sexual misconduct, dating and domestic violence, and stalking were reported in

the last fiscal year;5 and

WHEREAS 13 of these reports were not carried through due to a decline to file, withdrawal of complaint, or

deciding not to further communicate with the Title IX office; and

WHEREAS Betsy DeVos, the U.S. Secretary of Education, announced her decision to rescind former

President Obama's guidelines on sexual violence and misconduct on college campuses on

September 22, 2017;7 and

WHEREAS	this decision increases the standard of evidence that must be available in sexual violence and misconduct cases; ⁸ and
WHEREAS	Senator Patty Murray, a democrat from Washington state, alleged that Secretary DeVos was allowing "predators to continue to roam college campuses" with her policy change; and
WHEREAS	this rollback on policy is likely to discourage students from reporting incidents of sexual violence and misconduct as the media and new recommended standard of evidence involved creates a stigma of victim blaming; and
WHEREAS	the language used by Betsy DeVos and communications from the Department of Education focuses largely on the rights of the accused with little mention on the rights and interests of the victim, this can push even more students to not come forward and erode the progress that college campuses have made to address sexual violence and misconduct; ¹⁰ and
WHEREAS	considering this new Title IX guidance will allow campuses to move from a "preponderance of evidence" to a "clear and convincing standard of proof;" and
WHEREAS	considering that preponderance of evidence is defined as the greater weight of the evidence required in a civil lawsuit for the trier of fact to decide in favor of one side or the other; now therefore, be it
RESOLVED	that the university provide more support and resources to victims of sexual violence and misconduct including creating more advocate trainings, comprehensive gender inclusive violence prevention programs, peer education programs, and continue to carry out the current procedures regarding sexual violence and misconduct on campus; and be it further
RESOLVED	CSULB ASI encourages the university to maintain the "preponderance of evidence" guidelines when investigating instances of sexual violence and misconduct to maintain the safety and consideration of those victims; and be it further
RESOLVED	CSULB ASI encourages Lobby Corps to include Title IX as one of the areas of focus for future lobby visits, including CHESS and local district visits; and to support any legislative bills that are in connection with improving Title IX and creating safer campuses free of sexual violence; and be it further
RESOLVED	that the protection of the campus community who are discriminated against based on, but not limited to: race, ethnicity, nationality, citizen status, political affiliation, religion, sexual
