WHEREAS the Associated Students Incorporated Board of Directors at California State University, Long Beach

is a recognized voice for over 37,000 students; and,

WHEREAS the CSULB ASI mission states, "the Associated Students of CSULB seeks to facilitate the

achievement of students' educational objectives and life goals through programs, services, and facilities that advocate student needs and interests, compel student representation in campus decision making and provide students with resources that they identify as necessary for their

intellectual, social and physical development1"; and,

WHEREAS the Trump Administration has stated that gender shall be redefined, therefore resulting in the

erasure of the identity of Transgender people across the nation<sup>2</sup>; and,

WHEREAS the new classification of gender is stated as "biological basis that is clear, grounded in science,

objective and administrable," this definition excludes and invalidates the experiences of

approximately 1.4 million Trans Americans<sup>3</sup>; and,

WHEREAS the LGBTQIA+ community is encompassing of many identities and has been a historically

underrepresented and undervalued community; and,

WHEREAS existing under the queer umbrella<sup>4</sup>, is the Trans community which is a further marginalized group

WHEREAS Trans people include those "who do not identify or exclusively identify with their sex assigned at

birth. The term transgender is not indicative of gender expression, sexual orientation, hormonal

makeup, physical anatomy, or how one is perceived in daily life"6; and.

WHEREAS that ASI recognizes Queer identities within our student body, faculty, alumni, staff, and

community members; and,

WHEREAS that ASI is an organization dedicated to inclusivity and embracing the intersectional identities

within our campus community; now therefore, be it,
