WHEREAS the Associated Students, Incorporated (ASI) Board of Directors at California State University,

Long Beach (CSULB) is the recognized voice for over 37,000 students; and

WHEREAS the CSULB ASI mission states: "The Associated Students of CSULB seeks to facilitate the

achievement of students' educational objectives and life goals through programs, services, and

facilities that advocate student needs and interests; 1" and

WHEREAS in 2017 Los Angeles County reported over 55,000 people are struggling with homelessness with

an estimate of over 15,700 people living in their vehicles;2 and

WHEREAS one in ten students within the California State University (CSU) system are experiencing

homelessness, and two in five face food instability, with one in five of those students facing very

low food security;3 and

WHEREAS as of March 2019, the average rent for a one bedroom apartment in Long Beach was \$2,092, a

12% increase from March 2018,4 showing a stark decline in housing affordability citywide and

exhibiting the housing crisis that the City of Long Beach is facing:5 and

WHEREAS that approximately 10% of the renters in Long Beach are comprised of students; and

WHEREAS students of CSULB are seeking to increase awareness and advocacy on campus and throughout

the City of Long Beach, including increases in campus resources and advocating for citywide

relief for housing insecurity and homelessness;6 and

WHEREAS there is a need to destignatize the experience of student homelessness and housing insecurity

through increased education, humanization, and awareness;7 and

WHEREAS every student at CSULB deserves the dignity of stable, affordable, and safe housing regardless of

their socioeconomic status; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI will continue to raise awareness regarding housing insecurity and expand efforts

through the work of the Social Justice and Equity Committee (SJEC) and the Commissioner for

Wellness Affairs; and be it further

**RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI will advocate for long-term housing solutions where students do not have to

exhaust loans before qualifying for emergency housing and assistance; and be it further

RESOLVED that CSULB ASI will continue to lobby local and state legislators in favor of legislation that will help alleviate student homelessness within the CSU system; and be it further **RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI will work alongside the executive director for housing to explore the idea of developing housing scholarships for students; and be it further that CSULB ASI will consistently support the students' needs for affordable housing by **RESOLVED** advocating for more affordable housing units in buildings intended for the students, including but not limited to the CSULB Downtown Village;8 and be it further that CSULB ASI will provide unbiased information to the student body regarding any potential **RESOLVED** ballot measures concerning housing in Long Beach through the efforts of Lobby Corps and SJEC; and be it further **RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI will make an active effort to decrease the stigma surrounding student homelessness by providing resources regarding this issue from local nonprofits, including but not limited to United Way-Everyone In, Long Beach Forward, Housing Long Beach, SCANPH, LINC Housing, and the Long Beach Gray Panthers as needed; and be it further **RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI supports any student engagement surrounding destigmatizing housing insecurity and educating the campus community about legislation and housing policy; and be it further **RESOLVED** that CSULB ASI encourages the University to support efforts in building and maintaining affordable housing intended for students; and be it further that CSULB ASI asks the University to highlight organizations on the Basic Needs website that RESOLVED can help transition people who have endured both long and short term housing insecurity, and organizations that provide opportunities for students to engage in advocacy for homelessness; and be it finally that an electronic copy of this resolution, upon its approval by the ASI President be distributed RESOLVED to CSULB President Jane Conoley, Interim Vice President for Student Affairs Mary Ann Takemoto, Dean of Students Piya Bose, Director of Basic Needs Ken Kelly, all current and future ASI Officers, the Daily 49er, and 22 West Media.
