WHEREAS

the Board of Directors of the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) has a duty to highlight the contributions of those who have demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of the educational and social experiences of the campus community at CSULB; and

WHEREAS

the Bylaws of the Associated Students California State University, Long Beach mandates that the Senate shall, " ... no later than the last day of October, adopt a Policy Agenda and Board of Directors' Initiatives outlining goals, priorities and the general direction of the Senate¹;"now therefore, be it

RESOLVED

that the incoming Senate continues to further develop all of the efforts the 2018-19 Senate has made on the following items:

Goal 1: Increase Visibility and Outreach to Students

- Continue "Meet the Senators" posters to ensure students know who their representatives are and how they can contact them
- Focus on concerns specific to housing, graduate students, transfer students, and student athletes through the focuses of the Senators-at-Large
- Consistently table throughout the school year, visit classrooms, and club meetings to speak about ASI

Goal 2: Increase Advocacy for Housing and Food Insecurity

- Continue to support the advocacy for housing and food insecure students through the Basic Needs program and inform constituents of the various resources
- Explore programs to address food and housing insecurity for students that do not hold social security benefits
- Advocate for increased housing resources where students do not need to exhaust loans to qualify for assistance
- Establish need-based mailboxes on campus for students facing housing insecurities
- Create visibility for the Feed a Need program on campus through digital advertising, creating pamphlets and information sheets to distribute at the Beach Pantry, and connect with the CalFresh representatives to consolidate efforts
- Advocate for diverse food options for students with religious and dietary food restrictions in the residential halls
- Work with commissioners, Housing and Residential Life Coordinators, and any other stakeholders to secure transitional housing for dedicated students who are at-risk of housing insecurity
- Develop a long-term plan to create healthier and more accessible food by having nutritious foods in the Beach Pantry

Goal 3: Advocate for More Effective Mental Health Resources

- Foster partnerships with the Student Health Services, Project OCEAN, and CAPS to advocate for increased mental health resources and to become familiar with existing resources
- Create proactive awareness around distressing events impacting students (ie. threat of a
 mass shooting in spring 2019 and the lockdown of fall 2019; many students were worried
 for their safety)
- Increase mental health resources through nontraditional avenues, including but not limited to, peer mentoring/counseling, group therapy, support circles
- Improve access to mental health resources by decreasing the wait time, hiring more counselors, raising awareness of Mental Health Awareness Month
- Improve access to mental health resources by also tracking student progress through data collected by CAPS via surveys at the end of each semester

Goal 4: Expanding Scholarship Services

- Advocate for scholarships that compensate students for unpaid internships
- Incorporate more flexible scholarship criteria and create specific scholarships for underrepresented groups
- Change the way international, graduate, parenting, and AB540 and Undocumented students receive scholarships by creating a fee waiver or check distributed scholarship
- Advocate for out-of-state fee waivers for international and out-of-state students

Goal 5: Improving Existing Services

- Collaborate with Lobby Corps and the Social Justice & Equity Committee to provide safe spaces and support for students, especially with the upcoming elections and current political climate
- Advocate for ADA accommodations and size inclusive furniture in both ASI and campuswide facilities
- Create ADA complaint form on the ASI website to ensure we are being held accountable to making our programs, services and facilitates accessible
- Contact notable textbook publishers, faculty and departments encouraging them to utilize digital textbooks to help lower the cost of attendance
- Explore the idea of creating an ASI emergency fund to assist students with temporary financial emergencies without having them exhaust all other financial avenues first; and be it finally
