WHEREAS the Board of Directors of the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) has a duty to highlight the contributions of those who have demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of the educational and social experience of the campus community at CSULB; and

WHEREAS the 2020-21 ASI Senate urges the incoming 2021-22 Senate to address issues and concerns that have arisen in the 2020-21 academic year; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the incoming Senate continues to further develop all of the efforts the 2020-21 Senate has made on the following items:

- Continue advocating for more resources and scholarship opportunities to support undocumented and international students
- Strengthen relationships with Black student organizations and work towards developing a resolution that calls for increased Black student admissions, retention rates, and academic success
- Continuously revisit the progress being made regarding the 2020-21 ASI Policy Agenda on Equity, Inclusion, and Racial Justice
- Continue supporting local, national, and global issues that affect our diverse population through advocacy, resolutions, and educational campaigns
- Continue assisting students with academic resources for a virtual model of learning and assisting the transition back to in person learning
- Continue the partnership with the Academic Senate to ensure proper outreach is conducted to notify students about policy changes such as the +/- grading policy proposal per SR #2021-13
- Resume advocating for Basic Needs information to be included on course syllabi by actively vocalizing student support in the Academic Senate per SR #2020-26
- Advocate for continuous support for housing and food insecure students through Basic Needs, the Jovenes partnership, and ASI Pop-Ups by Beach Pantry
- Seek support from the Commissioner for Pregnant and Parenting Students to advocate for additional infant and school supply products within the Beach Pantry
- Continue partnerships with Student Health Services (SHS), Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS), and Project Ocean to further expand mental health resources and help promote existing efforts
- Advocate for more mental health services by calling for the redistribution of University Police Department funding to CAPS per SR #2021-14
- Advocate for administration's creation of a category for South West Asian North African (SWANA) students as per SR #2021-12

- Continue advocating for increased visibility and resources for cultural resource centers as the Office of Multicultural Affairs looks to relocate them
- Advocate for the continuation of COVID testing on campus and vaccine administration
- Advocate for more transparency with student leadership scholarships awards
- Establish ASI outreach efforts early in each semester like previous “100 Days, 100 Classes” or “50 Days, 50 Orgs”
- Continue to do Instagram Lives and 22 West Media’s Mornings on the Beach to connect with students and highlight senator roles
- Continue building relationships with various student organizations to establish solidarity and collaborative advocacy, and be it finally
