Outdoor furniture had been installed on the ASI government patio as well as in other areas on the third floor of the USU.

The Pantry Kitchen was nearing completion. The official name was still under consideration.

A specified number of capital projects would be completed during spring break. The projects included lighting controls at the Student Recreation and Wellness Center (SRWC), spa replaster at the SRWC, the key lock system on select doors within the USU, and an upgrade to the billiards area.
